Nursery

This week in Nursery we have been exploring slime. The children have had a great time and have used some fantastic words to describe how it feels "It's joggly, it's funny" "sticky water" it's so slippery" This thing's slimy" "It's sticky, squasy and green".







Reception

This week the children really enjoyed making 'Glitter Jars.' The glitter in the jar represents what our brains does when we are angry or calm. When we feel calm our emotions are a bit like the glitter, they are soft, settled and calm. When we are feeling sad, angry or worried our emotions look a bit like the glitter when we shake the jar. They are jumping around mixing together and are all a bit crazy. The children are starting to use the glitter jars to help calm themselves down when they are angry. They shake the pot and practice 'happy breathing' until the glitter settles. This helps them to release the stress and return to a sense of calm.

We have also been fortunate enough to have another virtual visit from Chester Zoo, the children were fascinated to learn all about lions this week.

Year 1 are currently writing their very own story called 'In the woods'. This week they designed their villain and then a character that is kind and helpful who would be able to rescue us from the villain.






Year 3

In this week's science lesson, we had an exciting opportunity to measure each other. Our findings were in line with the whole school results of girls being taller than boys.




Year 6
