




As part of our new topic 'Wonderful Weather,' Year 1 have explored hot and cold colours through art.

We enjoyed seeing everyone's costumes for World Book Day and there were characters ranging from Willy Wonka to Alice in Wonderland to Mr Bump.





Year 4

On Monday, we had our Pens' down day and explored what a Victorian school would have been like. The children arrived at school to strict teachers, paying for their education and a different classroom layout. We separated into two classrooms, one for boys and the other girls. This morning, we had an arithmetic lesson and recalled all our time tables. We then used our measurement skills to measure the ingredients to make Victoria Sponge cupcakes. In Literacy, we wrote in sand trays and used slate to write. Then, we looked at a poem talking about Victorian schooling compared to ours and performed in our groups a stanza to our class friends. After Literacy, we performed PE drills that they would have done in Victorian times. In the afternoon, the girls participated in finger knitting and the boys went gardening. We explored some leisure activities, including playing ball with a cloth, exploring Victorian toys and Ring a Ring a Roses. Finally, we tried to create our own Victorian toy.









This week year 5 have been participating in many activities for world book day. On Tuesday and Wednesday we took part in a dance workshop, during which we produced a piece of dance retelling the story of The Lorax by Dr. Suess. It was great fun and the finished pieces can be watched by scanning the QR codes bellow. On Thursday, we dressed up as our favourite book characters. We designed a front cover for a book containing the character that we were dressed up as and made a book mark to use when reading in school. It was lovely to see so many children in school sharing their love of books.
