During our Science lesson, children have been exploring the different parts of a real plant. They were able to identify the leaves, flowers, stem and roots on a range of varieties.









Nursery

Next, we sorted colourful items into two groups, blue and not blue. Then, the children enjoyed taking turns to make bright blue playdough by mixing the ingredients using a spoon and a bowl. One of our favourite areas in nursery is definitely the playdough area.

We used our prior knowledge and facts we had retained from our trip to Thurstaston beach last week to create table's showing a food chain of: Sea lettuce, limpets, hermit crabs and seagulls. This week in RE, year 3 began to learn about Diwali. Working in teams, they had lots of fun creating Rangoli patterns. It was really good fun but very messy!!









Year 4

This week in Science, we have been exploring pitch. We have used different instruments and vibrations to discover the relationship between vibrations and pitch. We have all created our own sets of panpipes! We can use the different length tubes to create a high or low pitch. Have a look at some of our instruments!
