Year 1

This week, Year 2 looked at shells under the electronic microscope. They were amazed at how much detail they could see and couldn't believe how different they looked.









Year 3

This week in RE we learnt about the story of Lakshmi and the washerwoman and the meaning of it. We then ordered the story and acted it out.













Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been completing our DT projects – Creating Instruments. We have been using our knowledge of sounds and vibrations to create a range of instruments. We have loved creating percussion instruments, string instruments and wind instruments!









Year 5

This week, the children have completed an experiment in RE today. Firstly, they created a representation of a crucifix using lollipop sticks and an elastic band. Once this was together, they filled a glass with water and added iodine to represent people's sins by making the water dirty. Then, the children stuck crystals to the crucifix which, when added to the water, turned the dirty water clear again. This showed how a friendship with God could be mended and how sins are forgiven.







Year 6

This week, Year 6 have made pizzas in DT to link with our Science topic. We used a microbe, yeast, and observed how it affected the dough we made to create a healthy pizza. We explored the different bases we could use to make our pizzas and also tasted lots of different herbs and spices to see what our favourites were to add to our toppings.

Watch out for a range of competitions to be announced in celebration assembly!








Reading News

Talking to your children about the books they read is one of the best ways to support your child's development. Here are some tips on how to start a book discussion with your child:

After your child has finished a book, ask questions like:

- What was your favourite part of the book? Why?
- Who was your favourite character? Why?
- What was the most interesting thing you learned from the book?
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?
- Would you have ended the book differently? Did it end the way you thought it would?
- Did the problem of the book's plot get solved?
- If you could change one thing in the book, what would it be?
