<u>The Hub</u>

The Hub 2's literacy focus for this half-term is non-fiction texts. This week the children have begun to construct sentences about their favourite things, and have used Clicker software to record and share their ideas.









Nursery

This week in nursery we have been working really hard to copy, extend and create ABAB patterns. First, we copied action patterns by clapping our hands and wiggling our fingers. We discussed which action would be next. Then, we began to change the actions by patting our knees and tapping our shoulders. We used a range of resources in nursery to create our own patterns.







Reception

This week we have introduced our new topic 'Wild Wonderful World', by sharing photographs and talking about the children's pets at home or their ideal pet. We discuss how we look after and care for animals by giving them food, water, love and shelter. The children have created some fantastic writing about pets during child-initiated time.

We have also explored animal habitats in our local park; woodlands, grass and pond. The children created a simple map of Queens Park, drawing homes for the animals that might live there.



Year 1

As part of our new topic 'Wonderful Weather,' Year 1 have explored hot and cold colours through art. They then used the style of the famous artist, Jackson Pollock to create a hot, cold and neutral painting. We used Jackson's technique of dripping and splat painting on the floor.











Year 2

This week, we started to learn about our 'Great Fire of London' topic by investigating what houses were like at the time. We looked at different sources to find out more about them before making our own version of a Tudor house. We put them all together to recreate Pudding Lane, which is where the fire started.



Year 3

Year 3 had a fantastic day on Monday with Tim, a music specialist. To start our new topic, we journeyed to the jungle and created rainforest soundscapes.



Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been introduced to our new text 'The firework makers daughter' by Sir Phillip Pullman. We used our create skills and our readers mind to create the setting of the opening scene.



Year 5

This week, Year 5 have started learning about The Invention of Hugo Cabret. Through narrative immersion, we stepped into the Gare du Nord and considered the features of the train station and the surrounding area. We thought of different ways we could describe the train station and role played the daily commute of Parisian citizens. We have created some fabulous pieces of writing.





Year 6

In Science this week, Year 6 worked in teams to investigate how shadows change when their proximity to light sources is altered. We found that the further the object is from the light source, the smaller the shadow becomes.

In the news this week

In countries across Europe, including Romania, Belgium, France, Hungary, Poland and Greece, tractors have been blocking city streets and motorways as farmers protest against certain European Union (EU) rules. Their concerns include falling incomes, rising red tape, and competition from imports. Both national governments and the EU are now under pressure to stop the demonstrations. One protesting farmer, Hugo Auge from France, told news reporters for CNN that the current system, 'makes a mockery of both farmers and consumers'.
