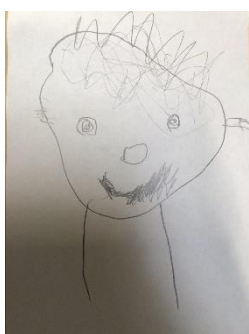
### The Hub

## Year 1

To start out new topic 'All About Me' the children have begun to explore their five senses. They took part in several experiments that involved their sense of smell, touch, sight, taste and hearing. They learnt which part of their body is associated with each sense.



## Year 2

Year 2 have been having lots of fun in their topic lessons and learning lots about the seaside. We began our learning by creating sculptures out of shells and pebbles which was lots of fun! We then used the maps and atlases to locate the UK and the four seas surrounding it.





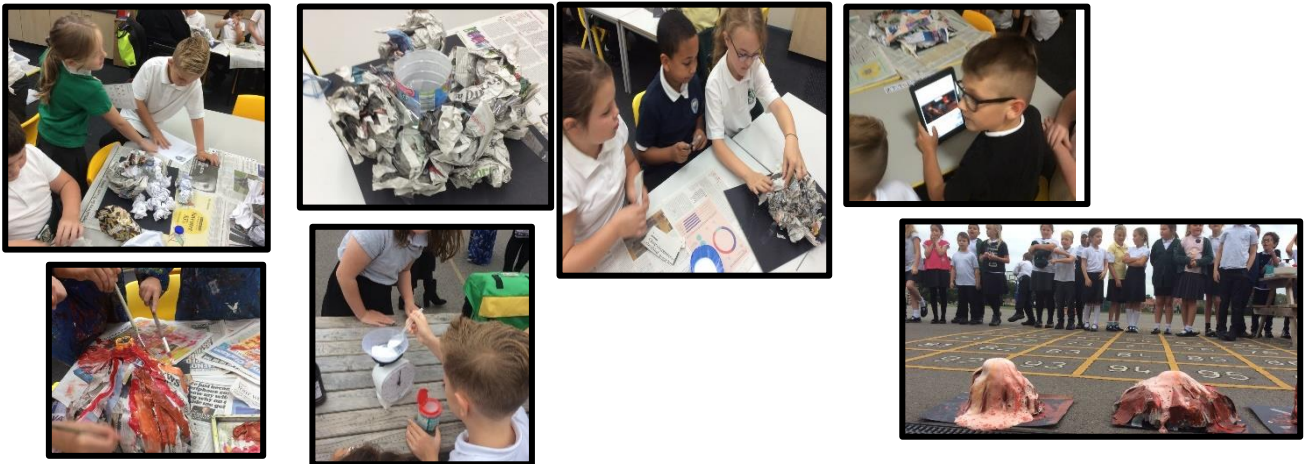
### Year 3

Year 3 have had a fabulous time in Literacy this week, using their drama skills to extend stories. They created sketches about the three little pigs hearing that there was a wolf in their village and the three bears discovering that there was an intruder in their house. The children used their bodies and furniture as props and practised displaying emotions.



## Year 4

Year 4 had a great day on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September for our Pens down day. For Pens down day, we were introduced to our new geography topic of earthquakes and volcanoes. In English, we created tv adverts to persuade people to visit a volcano on holiday. In maths, we used our measuring skills to create the 'lava' for our volcanoes that we created. This week we have also created our own string telephone in Science for our topic on sound.



## Year 5

Year 5 had a great day on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September for our Pens down day. We travelled to outer space! We were so lucky to have Wonderdome come to our school and be able to see a really clear view of the planets in our solar system. We also learned about stars and space travel, so we are now super excited to learn more in our science lessons. We also spent lots of time creating pieces of art and making our own mnemonic to remember the order of the planets.





## Year 6

Year 6 have had a great start to the term. On Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September, we had Pens Down Day, where we introduced our new geography topic. This half term, we are learning about where things come from and, in particular, we have been looking at Fairtrade. The children read some stories about how Fairtrade has affected real people and we then tried some Fairtrade food. After considering the positives, we started to wonder whether Fairtrade is doing enough for people in developing countries. Once we had considered both sides to the argument, we had a class debate.

### Type 1 Diabetes – Do you know the 4 Ts?

Type 1 Diabetes is the most common type of diabetes found in children and young adults. School staff and parents play a key role in spotting the early signs that a child or young person may have Type 1 Diabetes.

These are the 4 Ts:

- Toilet - a child may go to the toilet a lot.
- Thirsty - a child may have a thirst they are unable to quench.
- Tired - a child may be more tired than usual.
- Thinner - a child could be losing weight If you spot these symptoms don't delay and act today. Undiagnosed Type 1 diabetes can be fatal
