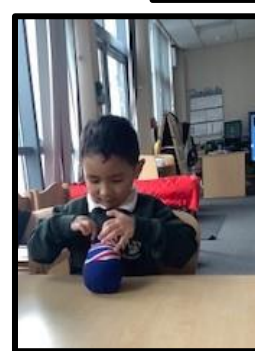

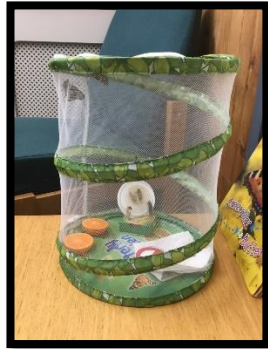
The Hub

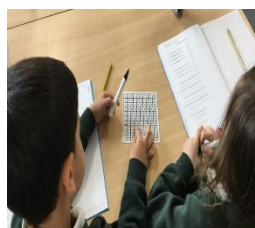
Reception

In maths this week, we have been working with numbers up to 100. We worked with our partner to count forwards and backwards on a number square and had to check that they were doing it correctly!



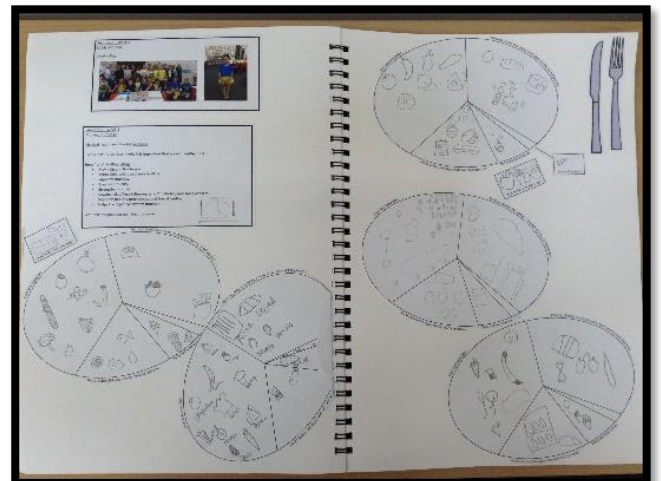
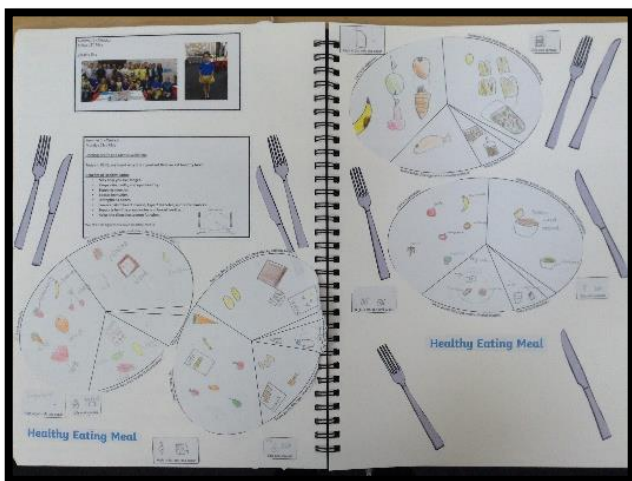
Year 2

This half term, Year 2 have been having lots of fun looking after their growing area.



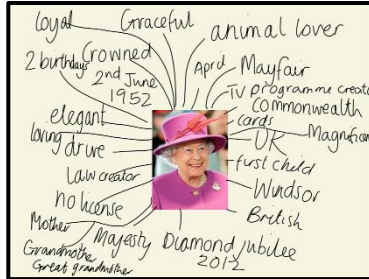
Year 3

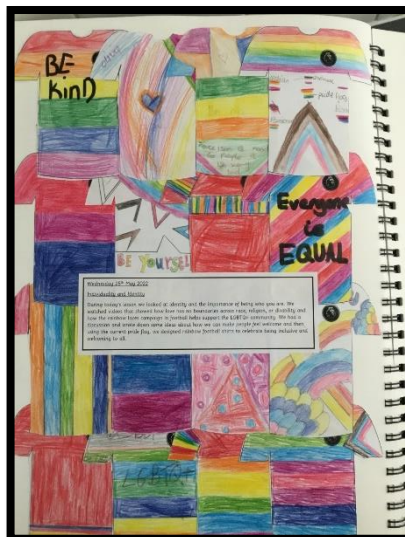

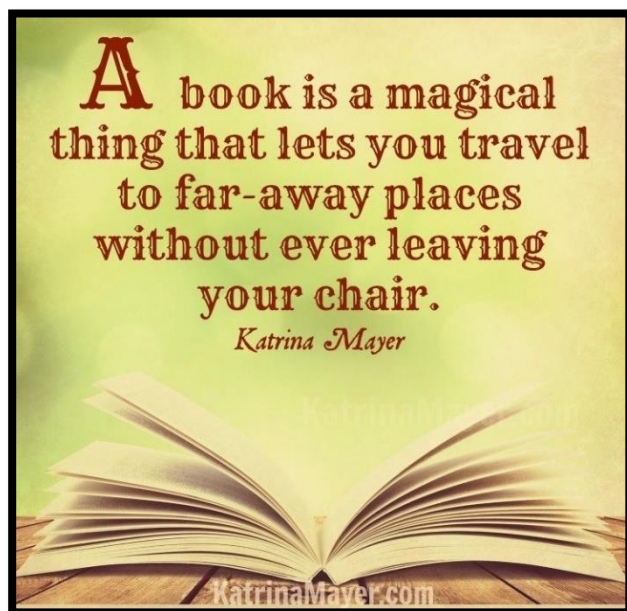

- Does this book remind you of anything else you've already read or seen?
- What kind of characters do you think will be in the book?
- What do you think is going to happen?
