The Hub

One of the books that we have been reading this half term is The Snail and the Whale by Julia Donaldson. We used this text to inspire some artwork by creating snails from modelling clay and, once they were dry, decorating them with paint and glitter.









Nursery

This week at Nursery, we have been continuing to look at different minibeast. First, we looked at the different pictures and named the mini beast. Next, we played a game of bingo with the minibeast. Then, we have played a game of What minibeast am I? We practised using our questioning skills e.g. do they have legs? Can they fly? Finally, we have enjoyed exploring the minibeast in the outdoor area.





Reception

This week, the children have been learning about a local hero Shaneze Reade who is a BMX racer from Crewe. We have also been finding out more about the Olympics and created torches in Free Flow.







Year 1

Since September, year 1 have been made familiar with the four seasons we have throughout the year. As we are now in summer, as part of our art learning, we painted a summer tree, inspired by the artist Claude Monet. We discussed how given it is a summer tree it needs to have lots of green leaves.

















Year 2

As part of our DT project, we sampled a range of bread products and rated the bread. We used this information to help us to think about how we want our bread to be. Working as a team we made the dough before carefully choosing our toppings once the bread had proved. After they were cooked, we tasted our bread to see if it had achieved the design criteria.

This week Year 3 have learnt to sew in DT and have made some INCREDIBLE wallets. Here are just a few...













Year 4

This half term, Year 4's topic in Science has been 'Brilliant Bubbles'. We have looked at regular blowing bubbles, bubbles in chocolate and the bubbles formed when sherbet hits our tongues. This week, we investigated the effect yeast has on breadmaking. We learnt that, when activated, yeast produces carbon dioxide which forms bubbles in the dough. As part of our investigation, we wanted to see which flour created the most bubbles, so measured how much each dough rose in an hour. Plain flour was the winner in 4B, and wholemeal flour won in 4A. It seems we may need to work on controlling our variables...! However, we had lots of fun and loved experiencing more brilliant bubbles!



Year 5

This week, the children went to Ruskin high school to take part in PE and DT activities. The children had an excellent time and enjoyed exploring the facilities within the school. They represented our school brilliantly. Well done year 5!



Logging on for just a **few minutes** every day will make a massive difference to basic number skills and support your child to become confident mathematicians!

Learning to tell the time

Telling the time is an **important skill in everyday life**, but we all know how tricky it is to learn despite the number of devices we have in our homes that keep us punctual.



Before your child will be able to tell the time on a clock, they will need to grasp how time relates to their own experiences. You can start to increase their awareness of time from a young age by doing some simple activities and games.

How can you help at home?

Make clocks together to display. This gives them practice in writing the numbers in order in the right places. You could also add the 5-minute increments outside the clock face so they start to recognise that when the long hand is on the number 4, it means 20 minutes have passed.
