


### **The Hub**

In Literacy the children in Hub 3 have been creating sentences about the new school building and the different spaces inside it. The have also thought about which area they like the best before photographing their favourite and writing about it to share with the rest of the class.









### **Nursery**

For our DT project this week, we created our seasonal bags. We used different skills including hand sewing stitches, using a sewing machine to join fabric together, cutting material and bringing our design to life. The children were really sensible with the equipment and have excellent bags to use throughout autumn.













## Year 6

In this week's geography lesson, Year 6 used an opinion line to form the basis of their class discussion about off-shoring and automation. They worked really hard to ensure that each comment was linked to the last. They also agreed how to be attentive listeners, because they understood the impact it has on the speaker.

Crewe//Makes builds on the town's proud tradition of making, champions the development of new making skills across different generations and communities, and looks forward to a future that embraces the creative promise of new technologies.

Over the coming months, Crewe//Makes will share creative opportunities for families, people who make or craft in their spare time, schools and colleges, professionals, established artists, and people starting their careers in the arts or creative industries.



Crewe//Makes will transform a shop in Crewe's The Market Shopping Centre into a space where artists and makers can exhibit work, crafters can craft, makers can make, and children and their adults can explore the joy of creating.

Events kick off in the October half-term on Saturday 26th October with family-friendly workshops. The space will host the work of Crewe//Makes' first artist-in-residence, David Jewkes, who works in the mediums of drawing and painting. The Crewe//Makes art space is open Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays and will continue into 2025.

Crewe//Makes has a launch event on Saturday 2 November between 11am - 4pm when Lyceum Square Ly2 is a space for the town's creativity. The event overturns the traditional notions of 'making' by featuring Caribbean cooking and Polish pickling alongside art, crafts and artistic traditions rooted in different cultural heritages. The event features Rangoli drawing, the hilarious food-themed performance 'Do What Your Mamma Told Yah!' from Just More Productions and a Bollywood dance workshop and performance from the Guinness-record-breaking RiRi's Dance Academy.

From 6pm-10pm, the event moves to Crewe Market Hall for a celebration of Diwali - the Hindu Festival of Lights - with Diwali Dhamaka. Explore global making traditions, shop for crafts like Indian jewelry, have your hands painted with henna, experience music and performance, watch cookery demonstrations on food from around the world and share delicious food, including Indian street food, with family and friends.

E-commerce company, Amazon, has told all staff they need to return to the office five days a week next year, ending the option to work from home. In a message to all workers, Chief Executive Andy Jassy said the company expected everyone to be in the office full time (apart from some exceptions) from 2nd January, 2025. Amazon's new policy is very different from the UK government's approach, which is to make flexible working a right for employees, as promised in a new law proposal, due to be announced later this year.
