Nursery

Reception

This week in the story 'The Owl Who is Afraid of the Dark', Plop the baby barn owl meets a lonely scout guarding a campfire. The children shared their ideas on how to help the scout not feel lonely and gave him advice on how to keep safe by the glowing fire. We met scout Jayden a year 6 pupil who told us about how he earns his badges by completing different activities. The children took on the role on a scout and have earned their own badges this week by making banana boats, collecting wood ready for the camp fire and making hot chocolate.







In topic, we have been creating created images of the Naughty Bus inspired by the work of the artist Hundertwasser. First, we experimented with his style. Next, we created an outline of the bus and painted it with different shades of the same colour. Finally, we used a marker pen to redefine the shape, and oil pastel to add pattern.



















On Monday, we followed the route that we had prepared last week to look at the different types of accommodation in our local area. We saw terraced houses, bungalows, flats and some semi-detached houses.











Year 3

In science we are learning about light and dark. This week, we have had lots of fun investigating what materials we could still see most easily even as we made the room darker.







During maths week, we learnt all about money! Year 4 took part in the Museum on the Mound Digital Workshop which introduced the children to what is money and how we use this in everyday life. We also looked at different forms of ancient money and became money detectives. We had lots of fun!

Field Work - Local visit to Crewe town centre

Today, we walked to Crewe town centre to observe and take photographs of some of the changes that have occurred in our local area throughout the years. We followed a planned map route there and back to school. Whilst in the town centre, we visited: Crewe Market Hall, Market Street and Crewe Bus Station.















We had a workshop with Jason King where we were able to explore various artefacts from WWII. We thought about who each of the items might have belonged to and what their experience of the war might have been. We then participated in an air raid warden drill, where we had to practise making noise to warn others and carrying stretchers without dropping our 'injured'. We then listened to some stories from people during the war and learnt more about how it affected each of these individuals. We will be using the stories we have heard and the information we learned about the artefacts to write a poem from the point of view of one of the WWII jackets we tried on. It was a brilliant day!
