







Reception

This week in Maths, we have been exploring the composition of 1, 2 and 3. We completed many practical activities to explore ways to partition a whole number, so that we could find different parts which make the same whole. For example; we took it in turns to throw 3 beanbags into a hoop and looked at how many landed inside the hoop and how many landed outside the hoop. We said the stem sentence 2 and 1 make 3 altogether.





Year 1

Year 1 were visited by Martyn, an aerobatics enthusiast, who came to show the children his gliders. He explained how they were made, and then flew one of them over the school field. We found out about the Wright Brothers and how they have influenced the aviation industry.









Year 2

Year 2 learnt how to retell the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' using different musical instruments. Firstly, they experimented with timbre and rhythm. Listening to the sound, they then chose an instrument and thought about which part of the story it could represent and why. For example, sticks, bricks or straw. Finally, we retold the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' using the story stick and added instruments as part of the sound scaping.









Year 3

This week in Geography, we have been learning about addresses. We wrote postcards and sent them home so hopefully they will be coming through your door in the next few days!














Year 4

This week, we have had lots of fun experimenting in science. We carried out an experiment to investigate what the melting point of ice was. We learnt that the Ice melted changing from a solid to a liquid, and that the melting point of ice is 0 Degrees Celsius.





Year 5

Year 5 have been working really hard in maths lessons this week. Mrs Cronshaw and Miss Latta's group have been using concrete resources to support them when finding factors of a number and common factors of multiple numbers. Well done everyone – keep up the good work!





Year 6

In Year 6, we have been studying microorganisms in Science. This week, we set up an enquiry to investigate which conditions can either speed up or slow down the growth of mould on bread. We thought carefully about our variables and decided that we would keep bread in a sandwich bag, but we would change the location that the bread was stored in throughout the week. Our bread will be stored in: the fridge, the freezer, the IT cupboard and under the sink. We will check in each day to observe any noticeable changes.






Picture News
