The Hubs

Over the past few weeks, the children in Hub 3 have been working with Mrs Walsh to create their very own aliens. They worked with air-dry clay to create their models which they then decorated using brightly coloured acrylic paints.











Nursery

As part of our story 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark' the children have been busy in the playdough area making worms for Plop the owl. We have also been helping the astronomer to sort the stars into the correct jars. The children are beginning to recognise the numerals 1, 2 and 3.



Reception

This week we have helped the astronomer from 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark' and we were able to experience the Sensory Room in the Hub. Before we entered, we used 'Imagined Action' to put on our space suits, helmets and space boots.



<u>Year 1</u>

This week year one has been spotting patterns using 2D and 3D shapes.



Year 2

In DT this week, we have used our findings from the bug hunt last week to design and build our structures. We tested the structures in our outdoor area overnight and then adapted our bug houses to make them stronger and weatherproof.



Year 3

As part of Science this week, Year 3 had lots of fun investigating transparent, translucent and opaque materials.



Year 4

In Science this week, we explored the melting point of chocolate. We deepened our understanding of what happens to the particles in matter when their state is changed. By holding a piece of chocolate between their hands, the children learnt that the heat energy produced by their body was giving energy to the solid particles, causing them to move more and spread out, thus becoming a liquid. It was pretty 'sweet' lesson!











Year 5

In literacy, we explored different clues and vocabulary words to uncover what we will be writing about this half term. We have learnt that we will be writing narrative with dialogue, using the characters from our new house. We then looked at pictures of the Forbidden Forest and 'read the pictures'. We created words and phrases to describe what we could see, hear, touch and smell whilst walking through our setting.



Year 6

Year 6 pupils have been taking part in Bikeability this week. They have been developing essential cycling skills and road safety awareness. Over the two days, they have practised riding confidently, navigating junctions, and understanding the rules of the road.






Art News

The Football Association (FA) has laid out new plans aimed at raising awareness and increasing participation in disability football. The strategy, called Football Without Limits, includes growing the Comets programme for young people aged 5–11. The FA says Comets will be the most inclusive format of the sport and will provide a safe and supportive space for children to start playing football.
