Nursery

Reception

We have continued to work with numbers up to 5 and we have been building our own staircase towers. We noticed how numbers increase in size when 1 more is added and that the order of the numbers when counting does not change. We also noticed that the numbers get smaller when we take 1 away.







Year 1

In RE this week, the children thought about the role of the innkeeper in the Christmas Story. They thought about how kind it was of him to offer Mary and Joseph a stable for the night. They learnt that because of this, many Christians believe that it is very important to help people in need, particularly at Christmas. The children thought about what they were hoping for at Christmas but then what other, less fortunate, people might wish for. They wrote a wish and then created a Christmas Tree on the other side.







In music this week, we played different instruments and learnt how to change the tempo and add an interval into our performance.







Year 3

In science this week we learnt about shadows and how they are formed. We have had lots of fun investigating which objects created shadows and what shapes the shadows were.







In literacy this week we used our oracy skills to create drama pieces based on our story of the Gladiator. We delved deeper and focused on the characters of Maximus and Commodus and was even lucky enough to meet the great General Maximus himself. Then, we used the wonderful story stick and soundscape to retell the final part where Maximus heads to the colosseum to compete in his battle for freedom!













The children got into role as the characters from their quests. They imagined that they had just found the vault hidden within the Forbidden Forest. They created a freeze frame to show how each character reacted when finding the vault. They thought about their facial expressions and body language.



We have been busy baking in Year 6 this week! In History, we have been learning about rationing as part of our WW2 topic and in our lesson this week we recreated a war-time classic: The National Loaf. We even made a mixed berry jam to go alongside our bread. The children thoroughly enjoyed baking and eating the bread and have even asked for copies of the recipe to take home!

Focus on Year 4

Year 4 have been learning about blending with oil pastels. We have been inspired by a recurring motif that we discovered in the work of Pop-Artist Jim Dine – the heart! We drew our hearts, then thought about picking three colours that are close together on the colour wheel, so that they would blend. By graduating from the darkest to the lightest, we tried to show the 3-D form of our hearts, adding a shadow in the background to heighten this effect. We are looking forward to completing our work next week.

Clubs


Clubs have now finished until after Christmas. They will restart on Monday 13th January 2025, more information will follow after Christmas.
