On Wednesday, the children in Hub 2 learnt all about Chinese New Year. As it is the year of the snake, the children learnt to move and sound like a snake, before completing some art work. <u>Nursery</u>

This week in nursery the children have been spending lots of time developing their gross motor skills in the outdoor area. We have been using the little and big brushes to sweep the puddles, rolling the hoops to our friends and carefully balancing on the large blocks.

Year 1

This week, year 1 have been learning about materials and the different properties they each have. We did an experiment in our teams to find out which material (nylon, cotton towel or felt) was the most waterproof and therefore the best material for an umbrella. We all agreed the nylon was waterproof.



Year 2

Last week, Year 2 learnt more about how Jewish people celebrate shabbat at home by recreating a traditional shabbat meal. We sampled challah, a Jewish bread and cholent, a traditional Jewish stew.



Year 3

This week, year 3 have been learning how to divide with remainders!



Year 4

We continued our research about The River Weaver. We collated our research and used Purple Mash to create a River Weaver Fact File, full of interesting fats about our local river!

We had lots of fun creating these, using our computing skills to do so. We even managed to add a few pictures to them at the end!









Year 5

Today we learnt about different forensic tests. We explored the ways that investigators would conduct these and tried these ourselves. We used ink to create fingerprints, clay to create teeth marks, chromatography to test ink stains and analysed handwriting samples and materials when looking at fibres. Finally, we took a cast of a footprint to look at the markings.



Year 6

In Science this week, Simon, from Wings and Things, came to visit us with a variety of animals. Using these creatures, he explained how a small change that a living thing goes through can enable it to become better suited to its environment. Did you know snakes used to have four legs and boas and pythons still have two legs? These adaptations have allowed these animals to evolve and change so that they do not die out. We saw a Common Boa Constrictor, Barn Owls, Giant African Land Snails and a Harris Hawk.

We will be using the amazing knowledge we gained from Science to inform our next piece of Literacy writing.
