The Hubs

Over the last two weeks the children have been learning about The Great Fire of London. The children have been thinking about the sights, sounds and smells that that people would have experienced during the fire.

They have written their ideas up as a newspaper report and today have aged their newspapers by scrunching them up and staining them.











Nursery

This week we have been exploring ice. First, we used our senses to discuss what we could see and what we could feel. The ice was very cold, wet and slippery! Throughout the week we explored different ways to melt the ice. We also created colourful pictures using ice and paint!







Reception

This week, we have enjoyed using the equipment in our outdoor area. We ensured the correct number of children were on each piece of equipment at a time and we waited our turn when there was a queue. We particularly enjoyed the spring beam and took our time crossing it.











Year 1

This week to start our DT project we thought about what we already knew about playground structures. We then went out to look at playground equipment around the school to see what we could find out about their structures. After our research, we created the design criteria which we referred to as we designed and made our equipment.









Year 2

Over the past few days we have been preparing for our special Chinese New Year Parade, which is normally held on the 15th day of the New Year. First, we created Chinese dragons. Then we composed some music inspired by traditional Chinese music. Finally, we had lots of fun going on a parade around the school with our dragons and playing our own piece of music that we composed.













Year 3

This week Year 3 have been learning about what life is like in space for astronauts. We discovered that the food astronauts eat is different to the food we eat because it has been dehydrated which helps preserve the food. We then investigated the process of how food is preserved by dehydration. We can't wait to see what our fruits like after it has been dehydrated.







Year 4

Today, we went on a field trip to Nantwich Lake where we deepened our understanding of the River Weaver that runs alongside it. We learnt so many interesting facts! Did you know that Nantwich Lake was built to prevent the town from flooding? It's also as salty as the sea! The River Weaver floods regularly, but when you look at how many tributaries join it, it isn't so surprising.









Year 5

Today, we stepped into the story of Deadman's Cove and completed a range of drama strategies – guided tour of the cove, conscience alley and hot seating where we interviewed a suspect, which uncovered the mysteries faced by our heroine Laura. We used our knowledge and forensic science skills to investigate different pieces of evidence including footprints, teeth marks, handwriting and fingerprints. We made sure to use gloves so we did not contaminate the evidence.









Year 6

It's been another very busy, and very exciting week in Year 6. We've been completing assessments, creating engaging pieces of writing, carrying out some practical tasks in science, as well as take part in a workshop about Racism. We're very proud of how hard the children are working.
