This week in Topic, in computing Year 1 used Purple Mash and the 2Go app. They had to use directional language such as forwards, turn right and turn left to direct their partner to the correct flower. They then used Beebots and playground mats. They learnt how to debug an algorithm when it went to the wrong piece of equipment.



Year 2

As part of our research into China, we have learnt about the effect of climate change on the habitats of pandas. The children then created a PowerPoint presentation to teach other people about it too. We inserted images, typed the text and created a moving image by drawing a panda and exploring the meta sketch lab for the first slide of the presentation. Finally, presented our PowerPoints to the Year 1 thinking about using a clear voice and presentational skills.




In DT this week, Year 3 have been designing packaging for space food. It was lots of fun!



After learning about the negative effect's humans can have on habitats, Year 4 students created PowerPoint presentations about three animals that face very different threats to their survival – polar bears, orangutans and black rhinos.

Their computing skills were absolutely brilliant and exceeded our expectations! They wowed their teachers and even learnt how to add animations to their slides – go team!



During our RE session, we continued to learn about the Hindu celebration of Holi. We read the story of Holi and created a 'story clock' to retell the events. Finally, we celebrated by throwing powered paint over another as this is one of the traditional festivities.








Year 6




Art News

Y5 Swimming



All children from 5B will be going swimming after Christmas as part of the compulsory national PE curriculum. The sessions will begin on the afternoon of Tuesday 14th January and will finish on Tuesday 11th February 2025.

The children will be travelling, by mini bus, to the Crewe Lifestyle Centre, accompanied by members of the Year 5 team. Your child will need to bring in their swimming costume/shorts and a towel. If your child forgets their kit, we will contact you during the morning to try to arrange for their kit to be dropped off. Children are not allowed to wear any jewellery in the pool, so all must be removed before they enter. Please ensure that all earrings are removed before children come to school, if the children cannot remove the earrings themselves. In addition, long hair must be tied up.

If your child has a medical condition which prevents them from swimming, they will require a signed doctor's note; otherwise they will be expected to swim. If your child has a one-off medical condition on one of their swimming sessions, then please speak directly to their class teacher, or send in a signed note. We will not accept the children's reasons for why they are missing swimming, without confirmation from an adult.

In the news this week

The Nepalese government has announced that, from September, climbers aiming for the world's highest mountain will have to pay just over £12,000 (\$15,000) during the main climbing season. This is over \$4,000 more than the previous permit fee for climbing Mount Everest. There have been concerns that there are too many people climbing the mountain, leaving rubbish and not respecting nature. It is hoped the extra money will go towards protecting the area from tourists.


