
Year 3


#### Year 5


In DT this week, we have been making seasonal pies. The children have learnt about seasonality, created recipes, baked and tasted their pies. We have had a brilliant DT week!



#### Year 6

In this week's science lesson, we were able to investigate how we can adapt a simple circuit to make bulbs brighter or dimmer. Throughout, we ensured that only one element of the circuit was changed, while everything else remained the same. We recorded our findings by drawing circuit diagrams to explain our results. We then even experimented with other components like buzzers to see how we could make the sound quieter or louder.

# How can we make connections with others?




### In the news this week
